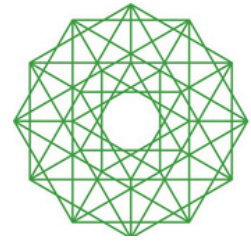


RV Winterizing Checklist

PARK YOUR UNIT

- Find a reliable commercial or private storage place
- Commercial: Check price, insurance and security
- Private: Draw up a Storage Agreement

DRAINING AND WINTERIZING YOUR UNIT

- Make sure you have enough non-toxic Anti-freeze
- Drain and flush all holding tanks (fresh water, black and gray)
- Drain water heater and lines (outside shower and toilet too)
- Remove inline water filters
- Disconnect inlet side of water pump or install converter kit
- Bypass water heater and Pump Anti-freeze throughout system

Connect tube from water pump inlet to Anti-freeze container. Turn on water pump and let system pressurize. Gradually open all hot and cold valves throughout the unit until Anti-freeze trickles out. Don't forget the outside shower and the toilet.

- Turn off water pump and depressurize by opening a faucet

LAST STEPS

- Double check that all electric heating elements are turned off
- Disconnect electronics
- Turn off propane and disconnect batteries



- Cover outside outlets
- Inspect roof for leaks
- Clean awning
- Make sure all windows are closed

LOCK UP AND DONE!

Pro-Tip:

During the wintertime mice tend to try and find a nice warm and covered place to nest. To keep them from entering your unit, cover all vents and other possible entry points with Dryer Sheets.

If you are leaving anything fabric, like bedsheets/bedding or camping clothes behind, don't forget to also leave mothballs or cedar wood balls in your drawers and closets.
